



### COST:

- \$140 per person (Cabin Style Lodging for two nights & five meals plus all activities)
- \$170 per person (Private, Hotel-Style Lodging for two nights & five meals, plus all activities)
  - Payment is due when registration is completed online
  - Price above is PER PERSON (\$280 for pair in cabin lodging / \$340 in hotel) for one mother and one daughter. Additional daughters can be registered for half price.
  - If registration is completed AFTER March 1, 2024 the cost will increase by \$10 per camper.
  - If registration is cancelled, \$40 per person "program cost" is non-refundable.

### LODGING:

There are two types of lodging available at Camp Zephyr. You will be able to choose your lodging on your registration form. Lodging options are:

- Private, Hotel Style Lodging:
  - Each of these rooms has linens provided and a private bathroom.
- Cabin Style Lodging:
  - Each of these cabins contains bunk beds and a bathroom. They hold anywhere from 16 to 50 mothers and daughters and are climate controlled.
  - Linens are not provided in these spaces. You will need to bring your own twin-size bedding
  - There is a space on registration forms to request another attending mother/daughter as cabin roommates

### STATE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS:

- Since there is a strong possibility you will be lodging with minors who are not your own, each Mother staying in cabin style (multi-occupancy) lodging, must have each of the three items listed below. These items may be turned in on the first day of the retreat:

1. Sex Offender Registry – <https://publicsite.dps.texas.gov/> - Each mother must have a documented search with "no results found" from this website. Results from this search would disqualify this adult from attending retreat. These checks must be run ANNUALLY.
2. Criminal History Check – Each mother staying in cabin lodging must perform and present a background check. There are several criminal history background check sites available from insurance companies or other such organizations. If you have already obtained a background check from your employer, church, etc this can be used and must be presented. This can also be obtained for a fee from the Texas website listed above. Certain convictions will preclude an adult's eligibility to attend camp. From the Texas Youth Camp Code, Subchapter B, Rule 265.12:

Youth camps shall not employ paid or unpaid staff members or volunteers at a youth camp, or permit any person to have unsupervised contact with campers other than their own children if the person has the following types of criminal convictions or deferred adjudications: a misdemeanor or felony under Texas Penal Code, Title 5 (Offenses Against the Person), Title 6 (Offenses Against the Family), Chapter 29 (Robbery) of Title 7, Chapter 43 (Public Indecency) or §42.072 (Stalking) of Title 9, §15.031 (Criminal Solicitation of a Minor) of Title 4, §38.17 (Failure to Stop or Report Aggravated Sexual Assault of Child) of Title 8, or any like offense under the law of another state or under federal law."

We prefer that you do these searches yourself, as registration is very hectic. Please make every effort to do so. These checks must be run ANNUALLY.

3. Abuse Prevention Training – This curriculum is available on the Zephyr website: <https://www.campzephyr.org/child-protection-training> You will be responsible for watching the video, and taking a short test over the information. You may then bring this test to be turned in on the first day of the retreat. This training is good for 24 months.

# PACKING LIST

- **Casual clothing for 2-3 days**
  - No spaghetti strap, midriff baring or strapless shirts.
  - No clothing advertising alcohol, tobacco, or containing suggestive sayings.
  - Shorts should be fingertip length.
  - If clothing is deemed inappropriate or revealing a guest may be required to change.
  - Water shoes are recommended to participate in kayaking at the waterfront.
  - Some guests do prefer to bring nicer clothes for evening worship but this is not required.
- **Swimsuit & beach towel**
  - T-shirts & shorts must be worn over swimsuits when traveling to and from water sites.
  - A modest, one-piece swimsuit is required. If a guest must wear a two-piece, a colored t-shirt must be worn over it at all times. Tankinis are permitted but must cover midsection.
- **Tennis shoes**
  - Flip flops are helpful for the pool but not ideal at all times due to stickers and ants that may be present.
- **Pillow & bedding suitable for twin bunk bed (if staying in cabin style lodging)**
  - Sheets, a Blanket and/or a Sleeping Bag.
- **Towels and toiletries for 2 nights**
- **Bible and pen for worship**
  - Each guest will be given a manual at registration that has a space for taking notes.
- **Sunscreen/Bug Spray**
- **Snacks (optional)**
  - While we do offer some peanut-containing snacks in our Snack Shack, we ask that NO peanuts/peanut butter snacks be brought to camp or allowed in dorms due to potential camper allergies.
  - Please keep snacks in a sealed container/Tupperware while in cabin/hotel room, as they do attract insects.
  - A water bottle is recommended.
    - Locations to fill these water bottles are available throughout camp.
- **Flashlight**
- **Spending money for the Snack Shack, Happy's Coffee Shop, Camp Store and/or guest artist merchandise (optional)**
  - Snack Shack items range from 50 cents to \$2, and items in the Camp Store start as low as \$1 while some items are priced at \$40.
  - Credit/debit cards and ApplePay are accepted at the Camp Store. The Snack Shack is cash only. Vending machines take cash and credit cards.
  - All other activities, a name tag, camp book and a t-shirt are included in the retreat cost.
